Triple awards boost for Sellafield's supply chain approach

Sellafield Ltd has been nominated for three prestigious national awards – and we're in good company.

We'll be competing with organisations including AstraZeneca, Formula1, and the Government's vaccines taskforce in the CIPS Excellence in Procurement awards.

Our nominations are in the following categories:

- best supplier relationship management initiative
- · best response to supply chain resilience in a crisis
- public procurement project of the year

Susan Lussem, Sellafield Ltd Supply Chain Director, said: "These nominations are fantastic recognition for the company.

"The CIPS awards really are the gold standard for our industry; the incredible diversity and quality of other shortlisted organisations is testament to that.

"I'd like to thank everyone who contributed, particularly our fantastic supply chain. Our success would not be possible without you."

Winners will be announced at a gala awards ceremony at London's Grosvenor Hotel on 22 September.

Our nomination in the 'best supplier relationship management initiative' recognises a collaboration with supplier management specialists State of Flux.

Launched in January 2018, the programme has grown into a market leader and now manages 19 relationships, accounting for projects worth approximately £900m.

Our Covid-19 response led to our nomination in the 'best response to supply chain resilience in a crisis'.

During the pandemic, we were able to ensure all of our supply lines were maintained, which allowed our internationally important mission to progress safely and securely. Additionally, we supported the local response in Cumbria and Warrington with PPE donations and release of personnel to volunteer in their communities.

Finally, Sellafield's Programme and Project Partners (PPP) was named a finalist in the 'public procurement project of the year' award.

PPP is described by CIPS as 'an unparalleled opportunity to deliver up to £7bn of critical national infrastructure differently over a 20-year partnership'.

CIPS, short for the Chartered Institute of Procurement and Supply, is the professional body for the procurement and supply profession.

Tier 2 spotlight on ADAPT

ADAPT - comprising Orano, Doosan and Atkins - is a non-integrated joint venture contracted to Sellafield Ltd within Lot 1 of the Decommissioning Delivery Partnership (DDP) framework. The key focus is to provide Sellafield with ADAPT's full range of capabilities and solutions spanning all aspects of decommissioning and waste management from the partners combined experience of serving the nuclear sector for over 50 years.

Paul Terry, ADAPT Framework Manager said: "ADAPT procures suppliers through one of the Joint Venture Partners and aims to ensure efficient delivery by balancing continuity of work for our own team members, supplemented by organisations from within the supply chain of all three partner companies.

"Engagement with the supply chain is normally undertaken at industry events and local forums where relationships are developed, and often SME companies are invited to share their capabilities via specific presentations to the ADAPT team.

"A list of trusted suppliers has developed over time based on performance, however ADAPT is always interested to learn more from organisations that are able to enhance solutions that ADAPT can offer to Sellafield."

Sellafield suppliers invest in Cumbria

Two Sellafield Ltd supply chain companies are growing their businesses in West Cumbria after winning new contracts.

Iron Mountain, the storage and information management services company, has unveiled a new office and increased its workforce as part of the expansion.

The firm's new base at Hensingham Business Park, Whitehaven, that will carry out scanning and archiving of engineering documents, will increase its local workforce from 36 to 61 employees.

The scale and complexity of the project allowed scope for the company to expand its West Cumbria operation. Find out more here.

Meanwhile, Romar Innovate has won a £30 million contract to provide personal protective equipment across the NDA group.

The Cleator Moor based company will provide services to NDA sites across the UK, including Sellafield, that will unlock additional investment in its West Cumbria operation.

Export Grants for SMEs

The Department for International Trade has launched its new Internationalisation Fund for eligible businesses in England. The fund is designed to support businesses looking to grow their international trade.

SMEs can apply for match-funded grants of between £1,000 and £9,000 which will be available for proposed future activities (subject to eligibility).

To secure a grant, the business will need to fund a proportion of the costs itself. This varies according to where your business is based and will be up to 50% of the total cost.

Funding is subject to availability within local regions, and will be prioritised for businesses who can demonstrate they have high export potential. The fund is supported by the European Regional Development Fund.

Supply Chain Mapping

As mentioned in previous bulletins, Sellafield Ltd has partnered with Resilinc Corporation for the provision of supply chain risk management and monitoring software. This will enable us to have greater understanding of the depth of our supply chain – along with the associated opportunities and risks.

Some of our Tier 2 partners have already been entering their sub-tier supply chain information into the Resilinc supplier portal and this is progressing well. As part of the progression of Resilinc we have now enabled 'supplier impact notifications'. This allows the Resilinc software to alert us to a risk event that could affect our supply chain based on location across the globe. This could be natural hazards such as floods and earthquakes, port closures, and human health risks, along with others. A well as notifying us, where contact details are in the Resilinc system, it will also send an email to suppliers which allows the user to click 'yes' or ' no' buttons to confirm if they have any potential impact.

It is extremely helpful if suppliers receive such an email to respond as it helps us to understand the potential impact to or supply chain (at multiple tiers) and work collaboratively with suppliers to implement responses if required.

Warrington Business Continuity Arrangements

Sellafield Ltd are looking for business continuity support from our suppliers who have accommodation based in Warrington. We are undertaking an optioneering exercise for the most suitable locations that meet the following key criteria:

- Available on short notice (circa. 5 minutes from an incident occurring at Hinton House);
- Available for a maximum period of circa. 2 hours;
- Be near Hinton House (this is dependent on the incident type);
- Able to accommodate up to 25 people (1,000 1,700 sqft) in a single room or two interconnecting rooms;
- Instant connectivity to WiFi to ensure communication between incident team and wider staff;
- Have access to welfare facilities (toilets)

We are proposing a reciprocal arrangement with our suppliers as the benefits of this would:

- Continue our collaborative working relationships;
- Negate the cost of renting/hiring additional space;
- Enable critical activities to continue from both a Sellafield and a supply chain perspective;
